WHAT IS BDFNC?

The Bleeding Disorders Foundation of North Carolina (BDFNC) is the only nonprofit organization in North Carolina dedicated to improving the quality of life of individuals and families impacted by bleeding disorders.

The Family Festival & Walk is our largest fundraiser that brings together people with bleeding disorders, parents, siblings, spouses, caregivers, grandparents, other relatives, friends, neighbors, donors, supporters, and other members of the general public to celebrate your fundraising efforts and to build a network of support and community.

One hundred percent of the proceeds raised go towards providing direct programs and services to people impacted by bleeding disorders.





BDFNC Programs and Services

- Peer support for men with bleeding disorders, women with bleeding disorders, parents, teens, and in Spanish.
- Education events & retreats
- Advocacy for important healthcare initiatives
- Education for medical providers, schools, and others

The Family Festival & Walk is BDFNC's largest fundraising event and gathering of the bleeding disorders community. Held in Charlotte in the spring and Raleigh in the fall, the event includes a walk in uptown Charlotte or at Lake Crabtree Park and a celebration including entertainment and awards. Through peer fundraising teams, people work with their individual networks to raise money and awareness about bleeding disorders. The Festival & Walk fundraiser allows BDFNC to pursue the mission of improving the quality of life of persons affected by bleeding disorders through advocacy, education, promotion of research,



and delivery of supportive programs and

services.

Why Should You Participate?

FUNDRAISING BENEFITS

\$40 pays for the cost of one person to attend an EDUCATION DINNER

\$60 pays for one piece of MEDICAL ID JEWELRY & LIFETIME MEMBERSHIP to American Medical ID

\$50 pays for
TRANSPORTATION
COSTS so a person
with a bleeding
disorder can get to
their medical
appointment

\$500 helps a community member PAY FOR RENT when out of work due to a bleeding disorder

\$600 pays for a family of 4 to attend a WEEKEND EDUCATION EVENT

- Last year, BDFNC provided education to 646 people with 35 events
- Last year, BDFNC provided \$91,821 in financial assistance for emergencies, medical IDs, travel assistance, and education scholarships
- BDFNC led the efforts to ban copay accumulator adjuster programs in North Carolina, so payments paid on behalf of a patient count towards their outof-pocket costs
- BDFNC collaborates and partners with the Hemophilia Federation of America and the National Bleeding Disorders Foundation
- BDFNC collaborates with coalitions and other organizations to raise awareness about bleeding disorders

How can I participate in the Family Festival & Walk?

Register as an individual and start or join a team! You can also donate or sign up to volunteer.

Do children need to register?

Yes, everyone who participates needs to register, including children.

What is the cost to register?

Registration is \$10 for adults. Children are free.

Can I register on the day of the event?

Yes. We will have onsite registration beginning at 8 AM on April 27.

I'm unable to complete the walk. Should I still participate?

Yes! There will be plenty of fun activities to enjoy, even if you cannot complete the walk.

Everyone who registers and attends the event will receive an official 2024 Family Festival & Walk T-shirt (while supplies last).

How much of the money raised directly impacts the bleeding disorders community?


100% of all proceeds are invested back into the bleeding disorders community providing supportive programs and services including financial assistance, medical IDs, education programs, support groups, and more!


How to Register:

- 1. Visit
 - secure.ggiv.com/event/2024charlotte
- 2. Click the "Register" tab at the top
- 3. Select if you registering an adult or a child (there is a \$10 registration fee for adults)
- 4. You will be asked if you would like to fundraise as an individual participant, or if you would like to join or start a team. If you select you would like to join a team, you will be provided with a list of teams to choose from or start a new team
- 5. You will be asked to choose a fundraising goal.
- 6. Enter your personal information and answer the questions
- 7. From here you can register additional participants or check out
- 8. Pay your registration fee and start fundrasiing



Entering cash or check donations:

- 1. Sign into your fundraising dashboard
- 2. Select "My Donations"
- 3. On the donations page you will see a box that says "+ Add Cash or Check"
- 4. Enter the information requested
- 5. The amount will be added your fundraising total
- 6. Bring the donation when you check in to the Festival & Walk on April 27



Text to Donate

With text messages being a primary tool to share information, this year, BDFNC has implemented Text2Donate to make your fundraising easier! Just follow the instructions below and donations can be made directly from your phone!



- OPEN THE MESSAGES APP AND CREATE A NEW MESSAGE
- TEXT "2024CHARLOTTE" AND THE AMOUNT YOU WOULD LIKE TO DONATE TO 50155
- OPEN THE LINK SENT BY 50155 TO ACCESS THE DONATION FORM
- ENTER PAYMENT AND OTHER REQUIRED INFORMATION AND SUBMIT TO COMPLETE THE DONATION
- AFTER THE DONATION IS COMPLETE, YOU WILL RECEIVE A TEXT MESSAGE FROM 50155 WITH A LINK TO THE RECEIPT

IF YOU WOULD LIKE TO DONATE TO A SPECIFIC TEAM OR INDIVIDUAL, CLICK THE "SELECT TEAM OR INDIVIDUAL" BUTTON UNDER THE DONATION RECIPIENT HEADING (WHICH IS THE SECTION ABOVE DONATION AMOUNTS)
